

Short-Term Training in a Medical Specialty Pathway

Short-term training positions are usually conducted in a sub-specialty area (e.g. glaucoma) to enable overseas specialists or specialists-in-training to upskill or gain further experience. These positions are often approximately 12 months long, but the timeframe may vary. The Medical Board of Australia (MBA) states that these positions are conducted on the understanding that the applicant will return to their country of training on completion. RANZCO assesses the suitability of the proposed training position for the specific applicant only. **Short-term training does not lead to specialist recognition in Australia.**

To be eligible for the short-term training in a medical specialty pathway, an International Medical Graduate (IMG) must have a primary qualification in medicine and surgery awarded by a training institution recognised by both the [Australian Medical Council](#) (AMC) and the [World Directory of Medical Schools](#) (WDOMS), and have satisfied all the training and examination requirements to practise in their field of specialty in his/her country of training, or who are no more than two years away from completing his/her specialist training overseas.

To apply for short-term training in a medical specialty pathway:

- The IMG applies for and is offered a short-term training position.
- The IMG applies to the AMC for primary source verification of their medical qualifications. **This must be obtained before an application is submitted to RANZCO.**
- The authorised representative of the Australian institution applies to RANZCO for approval of the proposed short-term training position. Please email img@ranzco.edu to request log in details for submitting the completed Short-Term Training Online Application including all required documents and the MBA Application for Assessment by a Specialist Medical College (AAMC-30).
- RANZCO assesses the suitability of the training position for the specific applicant.
- The IMG applies to AHPRA for appropriate medical registration to undertake the short-term training position.
