

## Scoring Guide for ophthalmic experience

**Applicants** – please note that while your ophthalmic work experience might count for relatively little in the overall centralised score, this additional information is essential for some of the networks to create their final shortlist.

**Scorers** – please score the applicants based on the ophthalmic work experience form and the applicant's work experience as noted in their CV

### **0 points: no ophthalmic clinical experience**

**1 point: basic experience.** Yes, to questions 1).

**2 points: more basic experience.** Yes, to questions 1) and 2).

**3 points:** evidence of some commitment to ophthalmic clinical experience beyond learning the basic exam technique.

Yes, to question 1), 2) and 3) with at least 3 months of on-call with 1:5 or more  
or

Yes, to questions 1), 2) and 4)

**4 points:** yes, to questions 1), 2), 3) and 4)

**5 points: more extensive experience typical of junior doctor role in an eye dept. (although the experience may have been gained in research projects or volunteering)**

Yes, to questions 1), 2), 3), 4) and 5) with more than 5 procedures each undertaken in at least 3 different ophthalmic procedures

**5.5 points: experience that is maximising the opportunities of pre-trainee level experience that should set them up very well to start as a trainee in networks that expect 1st year trainees to be on call from the start**

Yes, to questions 1), 2), 3), 4) and 5) with more than 5 procedures each undertaken in at least 6 different ophthalmic procedures

**6 points:** Yes, to question 6) - this is for a Temporary Training Registrar (TTR) role i.e. 2 supervised theatre lists and 4 supervised clinics per week with at least 3 months experience in such a role in the last 3 years. As confirmed by the College.
